This ongoing communication and planning has allowed us to validate the effectiveness of our emergency preparedness. It has also allowed us to focus our efforts in areas that are in need of improvement. While we may not be able to share details or specifics of our plans, please know that they are in place.

With great thanks to the Throop Police, and our invaluable School Resource Officers, the district is able to receive first-hand knowledge, information and training in many areas of safety and emergency preparedness. We are also fortunate to have the expertise of police, fire and emergency response departments in Olyphant and Dickson City who also work with the district. The collaboration of all of these agencies is essential to our commitment to student safety and security.

In terms of collaboration, it is necessary for us, as a community, to work together in our efforts. We care deeply for all of our students. We also need your assistance as parents, guardians, and community members to maintain an open line of communication, especially if you know someone is hurting or struggling.
